Initial home visit



Onward Referrals



Follow up visits



Equipment installation



Home safety/security assessment undertaken

No form filling, no waiting list and no cost to client

Thinking with home safety and security in mind





Results/Service Benefits

- Number of hospital admissions following a home accident involving children aged 16 and under
 — rate per 1000 population has decreased from 4.00 in 2005 to 3.07 in 2009
- Number of hospital admissions, following a home accident involving older people aged 65+ - rate per 1000 population has decreased from 9.91 in 2005 to 9.63 in 2009
- Fear of crime decrease from 56% to 24% of Fife's residents being very or fairly worried about being victim of crime since 2000
- Accidental dwelling fires rate of accidental dwelling fires has decreased from 7.4 in 2008/09 to 6.99 in 2009/10
